



THE AREA

The Ysoro Marsh, pulsates with life. A natural nursery birthed from the spillover of the Paraná River. Golden dorados hone their fighting spirit in this fertile ecosystem where diverse wildlife make your visit unique and picturesque. Local "Paisanos" raising cattle and navigating among islands on wooden canoes bring a colorful background.

Located in the Stella Maris Hamlet it was declared a Province Natural Reserve in 2023. Short and direct connection with the main river creates a traffic of large golden dorado inside the wetlands especially when waters are dropping.

Location: Ysoro Wetlands. Corrientes Province, Argentina

Capacity: up to 8 anglers

Accomodation: 4 shared rooms with private bathroom

Notes: Boats are docked just a few yards away from the rooms

FISHING

Season: Year Round

How: 16' skiff 40 HP minnkota 55lb and push pole. 1 angler at the time, and 2 anglers fishing simultaneously

Waters: Ysoro Wetlands and mid section of the Paraná River.

Species: Golden Dorado + side catches (Pacui, Vampire fish, wolfish, catfish..)

GEAR

6wt at Ysoro Wetland

8wt at Parana River

Tropical WFF for each rod and Clear Wet Tip intermediate for dorado in #8

Leader MONO (avoid fluorocarbon) in 0.50 mm - 0.70 mm - 0.80 mm - 0.90 mm

Wire Tippet 40lbs





THE FISHING

Action guaranteed, giving you the chance to tune up with strip setting and acrobatic fights.

Lagoons and channels makes Ysoro Wetlands an intimate environment. Short distance casts, smaller flies, lighter rods and surface patterns make Jetu'u such a friendly fishery for all anglers no matter skill levels. Apart from GD you will encounter a great variety of other species.

16' skiffs with casting platforms at bow and stern allows 2 anglers to fish simultaneously. Guide maneuvers to the perfect spot with remote control Minnkota Motors.

THE LODGE

Jetu'u offers 4 rooms that accommodates 8 anglers. Every room face the gallery where the outdoor breakfast area allows the day to start looking at the Wentland. The main dining room and bar are home for cocktail happy hours every day before dinner. Jetu'u special charm welcomes our guests to the local culture and traditions.

"Ibera" means "shiny water" in Guarani. Thousands of years ago, the Paraná River dramatically changed course, leaving behind a vast freshwater treasure. Rainfall filled the former river bank, inspiring myths and legends. We're honored to be the only outfitter in Argentina's newest national park, protecting this pristine wilderness.

THE FISHING

Imagine targeting Golden Dorado in a maze of clearwater channels; an intimate and unforgettable experience. Expect plentiful medium-sized fish (4-8 lbs) with chances of trophy catches (15-20 lbs). We use small, maneuverable skiffs with guides poling from the stern.

Season: September through December, February through May.

THE LODGE

La Alondra'i, a historic 100-year-old house, lies in Concepcion del Yaguarete Cora, offering a glimpse into Gaucho culture. Restored to its former glory, it features 6 spacious rooms that open to a gallery over a central yard. Two different dining rooms give ambiance for breakfast and dinners. Local artisans and musicians regularly visit the lodge to bring cultural immersion and entertainment.

THE CAMPS, WITHIN THE IBERA **MARSH**

The marsh is so vast and intricate that after months of scouting and exploring, searching for the best experience, fishing and meeting locals, sharing and helping, we realized that what we were doing was the best program itself.

"Ibera Rugua" is the Base Camp. Omar's cabin. Local paisano, true "esterero", we are lucky to be friends with and enjoy his hospitality. 2 double rooms and 2 single rooms with shared bathroom power light in the middle of the marsh. Ibera rugua literally means "deep in the shiny water". Truly unbelievable.

Two satellite camps "El Disparo" and "Yaguarete Ava" take the experience to the next level and allow you



to fish new water every day, fish further every day, fish it all...no impossible. We don't lose time back and forth and we dont disturb the overwhelming spirit of the Ibera marsh.







Itati Lodge Upper Paraná River

Home of the largest golden dorado on the planet, where it all started, the Upper Parana River is the destination where anglers have the opportunity to connect with a lifetime TROPHY.

At Itati lodge focus is the name of the game, each and every cast might be it, each every strip can hide the monster, be ready, be there.

Another feature of the Upper Parana River is the possibility of targeting Pacu and pirapita under jungle trees hanging over the banks.

THE AREA

Upper Parana starts as tail water of Yacyreta Dam and flows for 135 miles until the junction with Paraguay River. The clearest water conditions you can encounter anywhere in the Parana making it ideal for fly fishing. The most productive spawning area of the system allows older resident fish to live year round and migratory fish that arrive for the spawn.

THE FISHING

Parana is the size of the Mississipi, presenting very enticing and super varied structures where we target these golden dorados. The big ones rely a lot on rock structures to ambush their prey fish, the sabalo. Rocky banks and islands are our favorite places to target them. Sandbars with light coloration, cutbanks

and island points where jungle trees have fallen into the waters are great too.

Pacu and Pira Pita action is out there for the taking, a fun break to heavy #8 adding more fish species to your list.

17' skiff boats with platforms at bow and stern making two angler to fish simultaneously. Boats are equipped with 100 HP outboard and a Minnkota 80 lbs at bow which is remote controlled by guides to hold position in the hot spot we are targeting. Additionally guides may use a push pole while fishing the flats.

THE LODGE

Placed on an elevated bank that overlooks the Parana, Itati Lodge offers accommodations in 6 rooms for 10 anglers. Dining room table inspired by the river size, where breakfast, lunch and dinners are served will not go unseen. Our guests enjoy an entertainment night by local musicians and dancers performing Chamame, the regional folk music.

Short 50 yards walk of "shame or fame" from your room to the Skiff with a short boat ride to the best action spots. The lodge is conveniently located 40 min away from Corrientes CNQ airport



Putting Science Behind Conservation and Management

Golden dorado are an iconic fish species of Neotropical watersheds. They are fierce predators that likely play an important ecological role in the waters they inhabit. Of course, their explosive strike, leaps, and beautiful colors put them on the bucket list of many anglers, with the recreational fishery helping to support the economy of local communities.

Like many freshwater fishes, Golden Dorado are facing a myriad of threats including overharvest, poor handling practices, habitat fragmentation by damming and water diversion, and a range of negative impacts from climate change. Although they are ecologically and economically important, scientific evidence necessary to inform the conservation and management of Golden Dorado is limited. Surprisingly, this is not unlike many other recreationally targeted fish species worldwide, however a considerable difference is the

will and determination to undertake the science and ensure that related conservation and management actions are embraced by all stakeholders.

In the Wake of Golden Dorado is a collaborative project focused on filling knowledge gaps that can contribute to the conservation and management of the species. The project is founded on the passion of the collaborators to see Golden Dorado populations remain healthy and strong. Founding partners in the project include fisheries scientists from tArgentina (National University of the Northeast, (Corrientes), the United States (University of Massachusetts Amherst), and Canada (Carleton University), the government of the Corrientes province, and Set Fly Fishing. We hope to broaden the collaboration to build greater unity tied to the sciencebased conservation of Golden Dorado.

This project is capitalizing on two existing efforts – external tagging of Golden Dorado managed by the National University of the Northeast, and genetics/genomics research by the University of Massachusetts Amherst (supported by the International Game Fish Association). Combined, preliminarily results demonstrate that the Golden Dorado in the Parana River watershed could be critically important for the maintenance of Golden Dorado populations in adjacent river systems.

With that, we are embarking on a new phase of the project that includes using of electronic tags and manual and fixed stations to quantify the movements, habitat use, and migrations of Golden Dorado in the Parana River. Although the physical scale of the Parana River is immense, we have several novel solutions are in reach to help achieve our goals. For this research, we already have some funding and in-kind support, but much more is need.





Who is Dr. Andy Danylchuk?

In the wake of the Golden Dorado, Dr. Andy Danylchuk has made it his mission to ensure these remarkable fish remain part of our world for future generations. As a professor of fish conservation at the University of Massachusetts Amherst, Andy's work extends far beyond academic research-it's a hands-on effort to protect the fish that captivate anglers across the globe.

Andy's fascination with Golden Dorado began when he encountered the deep passion of local anglers and conservationists in Corrientes, Argentina. They sought scientific knowledge to understand how this iconic species responds to the challenges of fishing and human impact. Andy stepped in to lead a project tracking the movement of Golden Dorado across their habitats, building a collaborative effort that includes scientists, recreational anglers, and local communities. His goal is simple yet profound: to use science to inform proactive conservation and management.

With over 200 published works, Andy has studied fish species all around the world-from bonefish in The Bahamas to arapaima in Guyana and tarpon in the U.S. Southeast-but his commitment to Golden Dorado

is something special. His work in Corrientes isn't just about catching fish; it's about creating a lasting legacy for the species and the people who rely on them.

Recognized for his ability to connect with both the scientific community and everyday anglers, Andy's contributions have earned him awards such as the Excellence in Public Outreach from the American Fisheries Society and the Flats Stewardship Award from Bonefish & Tarpon Trust. An ambassador for Patagonia and advisor for Keep Fish Wet, Andy continues to inspire anglers to not only enjoy the sport but also take part in preserving it for the future.
